School Improvement Plan 2022-2026

Our school is in the third year of its School Improvement Plan. Our two key priorities are;

- 1. Improve academic growth for students
- 2. Equip students with the capabilities to learn and live successfully

One of the important strategies for improving academic growth is for teachers to develop new strategies for teaching in the classroom and to receive feedback about this from peers and/or supervisors through lesson observations. Teachers are continuing to build their repertoire of teaching strategies based on learning data from students as well as current research on those strategies that have the greatest impact. Teachers will be observing each other throughout the term to provide feedback based on a framework that is aligned to the teaching standards of Australian; https://www.aitsl.edu.au/lead-develop/develop-others/classroom-observation

During term 2 we were able to recruit a new staff member to assist with careers planning and work experience, Alex Brown. Part of the career's planning process is to help students of all ages identify their strength, interests and to set goals for self-improvement and achievement. Exploring these attributes is part of the school's socio-emotional learning program called Pastoral Care (PC). Ms Brown is working closest with the Pastoral Care Advisors to help plan lessons that are delivered by the PC teachers. The PC teacher then helps students to work through a range of activities that will strengthen their relationships with others and increase self-awareness which will equip them with the capabilities to learn and live successfully, both now and into the future.



NAPLAN Results for Year 7 and 9 students

NAPLAN results for year 7 and 9 students will be posted home next week. I hope that you will find that this report gives you some information about your child's literacy and numeracy progress. It is one piece of information that gives us some indication of how individuals and groups of students are progressing. Celebrating our students




